



**Articulation Agreement**

1. Transfer Institution: Gateway Technical College  
 Degree: Associate of Applied Science  
 Program:  
     Criminal Justice Studies
  
2. Degree Granting Institution: University of Wisconsin Oshkosh  
 Degree: Bachelor of Applied Studies  
 Program: Criminal Justice major (online)
  
3. Rationale: This agreement is being established in order to expand educational opportunities for graduates of Gateway Technical College and to strengthen the educational partnership between UW Oshkosh and the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS).
  
4. Gateway Technical College course/credits accepted in transfer and UW Oshkosh equivalent course/credits:

In addition to the courses listed in the table above, a block of transfer credits will be awarded at admission into the online Criminal Justice major for completion of one of the Gateway Technical College programs listed in #1 above. (See attachments for the number of block credits to be transferred.)

5. Credits from Gateway Technical College to transfer to UW Oshkosh: See attachments.
  
6. Other UW Oshkosh academic requirements that the student must satisfy:
  - Earn at least 120 credits.
  - Earn a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher.
  - Earn at least 30 credits at UW Oshkosh.
  - Earn at least 30 credits from a 4-year institution.
  - Earn at least 35 credits in 300/400 level courses.

7. Advising. UW Oshkosh and Gateway will provide academic advising to Gateway learners inquiring about UW Oshkosh programs. Learners will be connected with a UW Oshkosh pre-advisor prior to transfer. UW Oshkosh and Gateway will share materials, catalogs, and other information to facilitate their understanding of requirements and programs. Gateway will assist UW Oshkosh in arranging recruitment events on its campuses.

8. Marketing. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach its student population. Each institution may provide a link to this agreement and/or the other institution at its website, with notice to the other party.

9. Accreditation. Both parties agree that failure to maintain regional accreditation will be ground for termination of the agreement. Failure to maintain accreditation required by the specific academic program (s) referenced in this agreement will be grounds for exclusion of that program from the agreement.

10. Tracking of Use. Gateway desires to track the use of articulation agreements by our students. If possible, UW Oshkosh will send Gateway the total number of students transferred from Gateway annually or other data that can be conveniently produced.

11. Cancellation. Both parties agree to provide at least one-hundred eighty (180) days' advance written notification of their intent to cancel this agreement. Gateway students who apply to UW Oshkosh prior to the cancellation date will be permitted to transfer credits under the agreement terms.


Conditions:

- The terms of this agreement apply only for the purposes of entry into the Bachelor of Applied Studies (BAS) degree in Criminal Justice at UW Oshkosh. Students admitted to UW Oshkosh under the terms of this agreement who subsequently elect to pursue a degree and/or major other than the BAS in Criminal Justice may encounter additional program requirements.
- Students from the above-mentioned Wisconsin Technical College must have successfully completed one of the Associate of Applied Science programs listed in #1 above (fulfilling all coursework stipulated therein) with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 or higher, and have graduated in 1990 or later, in order for inclusion under this agreement. The terms of the agreement do **not** apply to students who have completed only a portion of the required course work for the Associate degree.

12. Effective date: July 01, 2017

13. Review date: This agreement will be reviewed in June 2020 and updated or extended at that time.






