



FIND A COMMUNITY WITH YOUR WELLNESS IN MIND



ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES AND HOW TO APPLY

Review of applications for fall 2023 begins on **Aug. 1, 2022**.

First-Year Applicants

- UW System application at apply.wisconsin.edu
- Unofficial or official high school transcript

For fall 2023 and spring 2024 applicants, submitting an ACT or SAT score is optional for admission review. Students may choose to submit test scores because they may be used as evaluation criteria for scholarships, The Honors College and academic scholar programs. Submitting your scores won't change the admission decision once it has been made.

MINIMUM COURSE REQUIREMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR FIRST-YEAR STUDENT ADMISSION

Students most likely to be successful in college and more likely to be admitted will have completed more than the minimum high school core course units noted below, particularly in math and science. Many of our first-year students have earned college credit while still in high school. For admissions consideration, students must complete:

- **English**—4 years
- **Math**—3 years
(*algebra, geometry and an additional upper-level math course that requires algebra and geometry as pre-requisites*)
- **Science**—3 years
- **Social Science**—3 years
- **Additional academic electives**—4 years
(*e.g. foreign language, fine arts or computer science*)

THE ADMISSIONS DECISION

UW Oshkosh reviews each application using a comprehensive review process. In addition to academic criteria, we consider leadership, community involvement and meaningful participation in extracurricular activities, such as clubs, organizations and employment.

First-Year Student Academic Factors

- Rigor of college preparatory high school curriculum
- Cumulative unweighted grade point average (GPA)
- High school class rank (when available)
- ACT or SAT test scores, if provided

Transfer Academic Factors

- Rigor of completed college courses
- Number of college transfer credits earned
- Individual course grades
- Collegiate cumulative GPA (2.5 preferred; minimum 2.0)
- High school academic record (if official high school transcript is required or submitted)

Key Nonacademic Factors for First-Year and Transfer Applicants

- Extracurricular involvement: leadership experience, volunteerism and community service
- Diversity of personal background, work experience and life circumstances
- Student's personal statement and responses to questions on the application
- Letters of recommendation (optional) may be helpful for students needing further support

All incoming first-year students are required to submit their official final high school transcript to ensure all academic units are achieved and they have successfully graduated from high school.

We will review your final high school transcript to ensure your senior year academic performance is consistent with or better than earlier semesters.

FIRST-YEAR AND TRANSFER STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

UW Oshkosh offers a variety of scholarships based on merit, academics, leadership achievements and other points of eligibility.
