

LETTER OF AGREEMENT:

Lakeshore Technical College General Studies Transfer Certificate and The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh

This Agreement, effective Spring semester 2021, stipulates the transfer of specific general education, elective, and competency credits from Lakeshore Technical College (LTC) to the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh.

Credits recognized under this Agreement will be awarded only to those students meet all UW Oshkosh admission requirements. In all instances, students will be admitted on a space available basis.

To be eligible to receive a degree from UW Oshkosh, students must complete all remaining general education, degree, support, major and area of emphasis credits not covered by this Agreement.

UW Oshkosh will accept in transfer the courses specified in the attached transfer credit grid. WTCS courses substituted for those specified in the attachment or taken as electives may be accepted in transfer on a course-by-course equivalency basis or as specified in other program-to-program Agreements.

It is understood that UW Oshkosh and LTC will utilize the following forms of cooperation:

- 1. exchange of information and materials about general education and other requirements;
- 2. participation in regular meetings between associates from both institutions.

This Letter of Agreement is effective as of the date this Letter is signed by all parties listed below, and it is subject to annual review by the UW Oshkosh Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs (or designee) and the LTC Vice President and Chief Academic Officer (or designee). It may be amended by written consent of both UW Oshkosh and LTC. Each institution shares in the responsibility for keeping its academic support and instructional staff informed of any changes in this Letter of Agreement.
