Memorandum of Understanding & Articulated Agreement between Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Associate of Arts/Associate of Science

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will cooperate in the delivery of Northeast Wisconsin Technical College's Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees. This memorandum of understanding describes the intent, spirit, and commitment of both parties in collaboration.

Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) Mission and Purpose:

"...to provide a system of technical colleges which enables eligible persons to acquire the occupational skills training necessary for full participation in the work force; which stresses job training and retraining; which recognizes the rapidly changing educational needs of residents to keep current with the demands of the work place and through its course offerings and programs facilitates educational options for residents; which fosters economic development; which provides education through associate degree programs and other programs below the baccalaureate level; which functions cooperatively with other educational institutions and other governmental bodies; and which provides services to all members of the public." (Wisconsin Statute, Chapter 38.001)

The additional purpose of the technical college system: "Provide a collegiate transfer program." (Wisconsin Statute, Chapter 38.001(1)(3)(b), 38.01(3).

Overall Objective

The University Transfer - Associate of Arts/Associate of Science degrees are designed to prepare students to enter Baccalaureate programs with a junior status at University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. Upon completion, students will have met the general education requirements of University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, with up to 61 credits, based on individual course selection, eligible for guaranteed admission and transfer. Elective options will allow students to select courses that appeal to future career plans. The curriculum proposed will provide sufficient options for enrollees to complete the Associate Degree requirements in two years and the Bachelor's Degree requirements in four years. Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) and University of Wisconsin Oshkosh (UWO) have developed a guaranteed transfer agreement (see Appendix A). NWTC and UWO agree to commit to a partnership under the terms of this memorandum of understanding (MOU) and all of its incorporated attachments.

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh have developed an AA/AS Articulated Agreement (see Appendix A).

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh agree to commit to a partnership under the terms of this MOU and all its incorporated attachments.

Demonstration of Need

This agreement demonstrates the need for this program throughout the Northeast Wisconsin Technical College district, while also supporting the WTCS mission of providing a statewide, full-time collegiate transfer program (WisconsinStatute, Chapter 38.001(1)(3)(b), 38.01(3).

 Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh seek to close the attainment gap by expanding and maximizing access to postsecondary education in the NWTC District. The Lumina Foundation, *A Stronger Nation: Wisconsin's Report 2019*, provides data regarding the attainment rate in Wisconsin and by county. According to the report, "Wisconsin's attainment rate is 53 percent, and the state is working toward its attainment goal of 60 percent by 2027." The NWTC district average is 36% (Brown-46.4, Door-41.8, Kewaunee-35.6, Oconto-31.7, Shawano-31.8, Florence-33.7, Marinette-29.6)

- Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh seek to better serve residents who already are seeking a transfer degree.
- Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh hope to further
 expand baccalaureate partnerships within the region. According to research completed by the
 Jack Kent Cooke Foundation, in the report titled, Persistence: The Success of Students who
 Transfer from Community Colleges to Selective Four-Year Institutions, it was found "that
 community college transfer students have equal to higher graduation rates than students
 enrolling from high school or transferring from other four-year institutions."³

It is believed that the partnership between Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will further improve attainment rates within Northeast Wisconsin. It will create access to higher education for residents of Northeast Wisconsin, resulting in a more educated workforce.

Guiding Principles

- Both institutions will contribute resources and expertise toward the common goal of providing the opportunity for students to earn an Associate of Arts/Associate of Science degree toward transfer to a baccalaureate degree.

- The institutions will create a consortium agreement for enrolled students to earn a general education Associate of Arts or Associate of Science Degree, conferred by Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, as approved by the WTCS Board and the UW System Board of Regents.

- The institutions will work collaboratively to transcript the courses and review and update the information annually.

- Each institution will include the new program collaboration in appropriate institutional publications, including transfer guides and web content.
 - Promotional materials for Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Liberal Arts Partnership will be created.
 Collaborative promotional materials for the Associate of Arts/Associate of Science will be developed.

Subject to FERPA and other restrictions, data on enrollment, retention, pre- and post-transfer, completion, and recruitment will be shared annually between the partnering institutions. Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will produce an annual report on student success metrics of the Liberal Arts Transfer A.A./A.S. program. If necessary, subsequent Data Share Agreements will be entered into between the Parties to facilitate the exchange of requested data.

- Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh academic advising Admissions will handle pre-advising. Non-matriculated students will not work with UARC for formal advising. teams will coordinate to offer co-advising to the Liberal Arts Transfer A.A./A.S. program including in-person and virtual advising appointments, informational sessions, and recruitment fairs.

To coordinate co-advising opportunities for students, Northeast Wisconsin Technical College will work with the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh to provide the following:

 Student transcripts, and related materials, and coursework in progress are needed to provide individual transfer credit evaluations.

NWTC will support students if they request a Release of Information to University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Northeast Wisconsin Technical College staff will work with prospective Liberal Arts Transfer A.A./A.S. program students to accomplish the following:

- Establish the student's program of interest at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh.
- Obtain a signed NWTC Student Authorization to Release Account Information form
- Request official NWTC transcripts upon application to University of Wisconsin Oshkosh.

Partner Roles and Responsibilities

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College will:

- Ensure all collaborative program documentation is accurate, up-to-date, and appropriateapprovals have been obtained from the Wisconsin Technical College System Office.
- Provide program direction for the entire curriculum, including a plan for program marketing.
- Access Credit for Prior Learning based on WTCS standards.
- Assign a Dean to provide program oversight and supervision.
- Award financial aid to students within the Associate Degree program.
- Hire and supervise instructors for courses offered as part of the degree program.
- Claim FTEs and college program and material fees from students enrolled in courses offered by Northeast Wisconsin Technical College.
- Confer the Liberal Arts A.A./A.S. degree.
- Process student applications and collect applicable application fees.
- Provide advising and support services.
 - Northeast Wisconsin Technical College will provide academic advising to assist new students enrolling in this program.
 - Students will have access to a variety of support services, including:

- Accommodation services
- Student Help Desk (technology support)
- Academic Coaching
- Collect a Student Authorization to Release Account Information form release of information form from the student and share the form with the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh.
 - o Please see Appendix C: Student Authorization to Release Account Information form
- Schedule at least one Advisory Committee meeting between the institutions to address any issues or concerns.
- Work collaboratively to develop plans for students to complete the program should it be necessary to discontinue it.

University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will:

- Provide an opportunity for NWTC Liberal Arts Transfer- Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degree graduate to complete a bachelor's degree.
- Participate in an annual coordination meeting as scheduled by NWTC.
- Collaborate and respond in a timely manner to course and programmatic matters brought forth by Northeast Wisconsin Technical College.
- Represent the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh at the Associate of Arts and the Associate of Science degrees in Liberal Studies Advisory Committee meetings.
- Program coordination at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will be through the Office of Academic Affairs.
- Collaborate with Northeast Wisconsin Technical College on services to students such as admission processes, registration records, transfer of credits, advising, support services, and other needed services.
- Maintain a commitment to students enrolled in the collaborative program.
 - UWO will have consistent contacts for NWTC faculty and staff related to registration, advising and student support.
 - Work collaboratively with NWTC to identify a NWTC advisor for the Liberal Arts Transfer -Associate of Arts/Associate of Science degrees.
- Work collaboratively to support student completion and transfer of the degrees should it be necessary to discontinue offerings.
- When students directly contact UWO about the program, UWO will refer students to a NWTC program advisor.
- Assess Credit for Prior Learning based on University of Wisconsin Oshkosh standards.

Introduction and Rationale:

This Agreement will guarantee the transfer of credits awarded to students who have earned an Associate of Arts / Associate of Science allow transfer and satisfy requirements within Baccalaureate Degree Program at UW Oshkosh.

The purpose of this Agreement and the creation of a transfer guide is to provide a seamless transfer process for students from NWTC who desire further education to enter UW Oshkosh. Students implementing this Agreement and who been awarded an Associates of Arts or Associates of Science Degree will transfer credits towards a selected Baccalaureate Program as set forth below. Students are required to successfully complete all UW Oshkosh degree requirements to earn a UW Oshkosh degree. Students will always be encouraged by NWTC to meet with a UW Oshkosh advisor regarding transfer specific to major of interest.

Presented below is the transfer guide, which will be maintained to detail the conditions under which courses required for the Associates of Arts or Associate of Science Degree will fulfill major or elective requirements with a selected Baccalaureate Program at UW Oshkosh. The transfer guide will also list remaining degree requirements to be completed at UW Oshkosh.

Northeast Wisconsin Technical College has reviewed courses that are part of current Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) university transfer degrees to align in title and number. Northeast Wisconsin Technical College classes will be available through in-person, online, Online Live delivery (online synchronous), or a combination of delivery modes, with some exceptions. Students will need to complete a minimum of 25% of the degree, or 16 credits, at NWTC; the degree will be awarded by NWTC.

Requirements:

All UW Oshkosh's General Education category requirements not met by transfer credits must be completed. 61 credits are required to complete the Associate Degree.

AA/AS Transfer Agreement Declaration of Intent

Qualified Northeast Wisconsin Technical College students will be guaranteed admission to the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh as a transfer student with junior status, having all their general education requirement met, after fulfilling the specified requirements:

- 1. Enroll as a new freshman or a transfer student at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College in the Liberal Arts Transfer Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) program.
- 2. Complete the Declaration of Intent below and email to your Academic Advisor at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College prior to completing 30 credits through Northeast Wisconsin Technical College's Liberal Arts Transfer AA or AS program.
- 3. Complete the credits needed for junior standing (i.e., not remedial) at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College and complete the Liberal Arts Transfer AA or AS degree.
- 4. Meet with an assigned NWTC Academic Advisor at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College at least once persemester while enrolled.
- 5. Earn a minimum 2.0 Cumulative GPA and a minimum 2.0 GPA the term prior to transfer to the Liberal Arts Transfer AA or AS program.
- 6.
