Memorandum of Understanding between Mid-State Technical College and University of Wisconsin Oshkosh Associate of Arts/Associate of Science

Mid-State Technical College and the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will cooperate in the delivery of Mid-State Technical College's Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees. This memorandum of understanding (MOU) describes the intent, spirit, and commitment of both parties in collaboration.

Overall Objective:

The Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees are designed to prepare students to enter baccalaureate programs with a junior status at the UW Oshkosh. Upon completion, students will have met the General Education requirements of the UW Oshkosh and will have up to 60 credits based on individual course selection, eligible for guaranteed admission and transfer. (Note that some specific degrees at UW Oshkosh include additional requirements beyond the General Education requirements). Elective options will allow students to select courses that appeal to future career plans. The proposed curriculum will provide sufficient options for enrollees to complete the requirements of many UW Oshkosh degree programs in two (2) years. Mid-State Technical College and the UW Oshkosh agree to commit to a partnership under the terms of this MOU and all incorporated attachments.

Partner Roles and Responsibilities:

Mid-State Technical College will:

- Ensure all collaborative program documentation is accurate and current with appropriate approvals having been obtained from the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS).
- Provide program direction for the entire curriculum, including a plan for program marketing.
- Accept credit for prior learning (CPL) based on WTCS standards.
- Assign a Dean or Associate Dean to provide program oversight and supervision.
- Award financial aid to eligible students within the associate degree program.
- Hire and supervise instructors for courses offered as part of the degree program.
- Claim full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment along with program and material fees from students in courses offered by Mid-State Technical College.
- Confer the Liberal Arts degree.
- Process student applications and collect applicable application fees.
- Provide advising and support services:

- Assign a program advisor (available virtually) to assist new students enrolling in this program.
 Upon program admission, this advisor will serve as the student's advisor through the entire program.
- Students will have access to a variety of support services, including:
 - Accommodation services
 - Student Success Center services (course and program support)
 - Technology Center services (technology support)
- Schedule at least one Advisory Committee meeting between the institutions to address any issues or concerns.
- Work collaboratively to develop plans for students to complete the program should it be necessary to discontinue it.

University of Wisconsin Oshkosh will:

- Collaborate and respond in a timely manner to course and programmatic matters brought forth by Mid-State Technical College.
- Coordinate the UW Oshkosh's program through the Office of the Provost.
- Collaborate with Mid-State Technical College on services to students such as admission processes, registration, records, transfer of credits, advising, support services, and other needed services.
- Maintain a commitment to students enrolled in the collaborative program.
- Provide a single contact for registration, advising, and student support.
- Work collaboratively to develop plans for students to complete the program should it be necessary to discontinue it.
- Refer students to the Mid-State Technical College program advisor when students contact the UW Oshkosh directly about the program.
