The Foundation of Your Education at UW Oshkosh

Students in all majors complete the USP. Since these courses will help to prepare you for advanced study at the university as well as life after graduation we encourage you to choose courses that satisfy or enhance major or degree requirements.

As you EXPLORE, you have choices. You will select courses in three categories: Nature (XM)/(XL), Culture (XC), and Society (XS) and encounter three intense and distinct "EXPLORE" courses called "QUEST." In the "QUEST" series students investigate three Signature Questions. The USP is completed through an advanced writing course that will "CONNECT" the Signature Questions.

SIGNATURE QUESTIONS

You will take one QUEST course focusing on each of the following UW Oshkosh Signature Questions:

1. **Sustainability:** How do people understand and create a more sustainable world?
2. **Civic Learning:** How do people understand and engage in community life?
3. **Intercultural Knowledge*:** How do people understand and bridge cultural differences?

**These courses also satisfy one of the following requirements: Ethnic Studies (ES) or Non-Western Culture (NW)*

APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO HUMAN SERVICES LEADERSHIP

INTRO TO HUMAN SERVICES (ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR PROGRAM INTRO COURSES)

***** As long as you meet all course prerequisites, you may enroll in our "Intro" courses. *****

1. Declared Human Services Leadership Major
2. Completion of at least 56 University recognized credits
3. Minimum Combined GPA: 2.5
4. Completion of request (including payment receipt) for Criminal Background Check. (Form available on HSL website or in the HSL Office, N/E-604.) Completed form with attached payment receipt is due in the HSL Office one week prior to the start of the semester.
5. Advising sheet must be signed by a COEHS advisor in UARC (Student Success Center Suite 202) **before** your "203 semester," and turned in to the Human Services Leadership office ... N/E-604.

PLEASE NOTE: Applications for both Internship and Advanced Internship may be obtained from (and must be returned to) N/E-619, or N/E-113. Forms are also available on the Human Services Leadership Office of Field Placement website.)

APPLICATION DEADLINES: October 1 for Spring registration and March 1 for Summer and Fall registration

OFFICIAL ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM AND TO INTERNSHIP (HUMAN SV-325)

***** When all prerequisites have been met, you may enroll in HUMAN SV-325. *****

1. Completion of a minimum of three courses in the Human Services Leadership major, as follows:
 - HUMAN SV-203 Introduction to Human Services
 - HUMAN SV-310 Interpersonal Relations in the Helping Professions
 - One additional **core** course, **either** HUMAN SV-320, HUMAN SV-335 or HUMAN SV-340.
2. Minimum Human Services Leadership GPA: 2.75
3. Minimum Combined GPA: 2.50
4. Completion of at least 65 University recognized credits.
5. Good Standing.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO ADVANCED INTERNSHIP (HUMAN SV-420/421/422)

***** When all prerequisites have been met, you may enroll in HUMAN SV-420/421/422. *****

1. Completion of all HSL **required program** courses except 440, which may be taken concurrently, and is offered in Fall and Spring semesters only.
2. Minimum Human Services Leadership GPA: 3.0
3. Minimum Combined GPA: 2.75
4. Completion of request (including payment receipt) for Criminal Background Check. Request form is included in Advanced Internship Application packet; and completed form - with payment receipt attached - must be turned in with application materials by the deadlines indicated.
5. Good Standing

FOR STUDENTS WHO WISH TO COMPLETE AN OUT-OF-AREA ADVANCED INTERNSHIP:

1. Minimum Human Services Leadership GPA: 3.5
2. Minimum Combined GPA: 3.0
3. "A" in Internship (HUMAN SV 325)
4. Positive report from initial experience in HUMAN SV-203
5. Unanimous approval by faculty
