The Foundation of Your Education at UW Oshkosh

Students in all majors complete general education courses through the University Studies Program. These general education courses will help to prepare you for advanced study at the university as well as life after graduation. We encourage you to choose courses to satisfy and enhance major and/or degree requirements.

The "QUEST" series will provide valuable experiences in addition to content courses that will satisfy credit requirements in the EXPLORE categories listed below. The University Studies Program is designed to also explore the following signature questions. Ideally students will take a course in each of the following:

1. **Sustainability:** How do people understand and create a more sustainable world?
2. **Civic Learning:** How do people understand and engage in community life?
3. **Intercultural Knowledge*:** How do people understand and bridge cultural differences?

Statistics – select one course (3 credits) **Developmental Math may be required.

Discipline-Specific Statistics: CJ 281 (XM), Econ 210 (XM), Psych 203 (XM), Soc 281 (XM)

- Psych 391 Developmental Psychology (Prereq: Psych 101 or 102Q1)

Interpersonal Skills Requirement – select one course (3 credits):

- Social Work 298 Interpersonal Skills (Prereq: Pre-SW major + SW 167)
 - Comm 213Q1 (XC)(ES) Interpersonal Communication: Ethnic Studies (Quest 1)

- Comm 214 (XC) Interpersonal Communication (Non-Quest)

Social Work Program Admission Requirements:

- Completion of USP coursework by the end of the application term
- 2.5 minimum Pre-Social Work Foundation GPA
- 2.75 minimum Social Work Gateway GPA
- Minimum of 50 hours of volunteer work
- Application = spring term only for a fall term start
- Program = 2 academic years (4 sem.) once admitted
