**h.** ACS Scholars Program – for minority students who are pursuing a career in chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering; must have at least a 3.0 GPA; undergraduate seniors are not eligible

i. INROADS Internship program – paid multi-year internships for students of color; paired with an INROADS mentor and a corporate mentor; must maintain a B average in school. Available for the following majors:
