- f. ABA Diversity Scholarship – for minority students who want to go into the travel, transportation, or tourism industries.
- g. ACS Scholars Program – for minority students who are pursuing a career in chemistry, biochemistry, or chemical engineering; must have at least a 3.0 GPA; undergraduate seniors are not eligible
