ACTIVE LEARNING

Certificate courses are conducted as participatory seminars. As a participant in the program, you will engage in discussions, interactive/experiential activities and share reflections with other learners. Certificate is a fully recognized credential that will appear on official UW Oshkosh transcripts.

RELEVANCE TO PRACTICE

Assignments and learning activities are designed to encourage participants to address relevant issues and challenges from your own professional practice. A guiding theme of the program is the integration of theoretical, conceptional knowledge with experience and practice-based knowledge.

CULMINATING PROJECT

Through the applied or field research project you will collect and analyze data to investigate a practice-based problem or issue of interest to you.
