UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN OSHKOSH

The University of Wisconsin Oshkosh was founded as the state's third normal school in 1871. President George S. Albee headed a faculty of five normal school teachers, the model school director and three teachers. Forty-three students attended the first day of classes. The Oshkosh State Normal School became the state's foremost teacher-training institution. A fire in 1916 destroyed the school's main building, which was replaced with Dempsey Hall in 1918.

In later years, as the focus and curriculum expanded, the institution underwent several name changes. A graduate school was added in 1963. In its centennial year of 1971, President Roger Earl Guiles guided UW Oshkosh's merger into the Wisconsin system.

Today, UW Oshkosh prepares students for fulfilling lives and challenging careers with 60 undergraduate majors, 15 master's degree



programs and, as of fall 2010, the University's first doctoral degree: the Doctorate of Nursing Practice. Chancellor Andrew J. Leavitt, who was appointed in November 2014, leads this vibrant educational institution — the third-largest university in Wisconsin with an on- and off-campus enrollment of 13,900.

The picturesque and environmentally conscious campus covers 171 acres and is home to four colleges — Business, Education and Human Services, Letters and Science, and Nursing. UW Oshkosh's focus on teaching is evident in its distinction of having won nine

UW System Regents Teaching Awards of Excellence.

UW Oshkosh also is committed to becoming a nationally recognized model for the "engaged university." Our striving to meet this goal is illustrated in the Points of Pride described on the following pages.

UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is governed by the Board of Regents, an 18-member board appointed by the governor. The board, in turn, appoints the system president, the chancellors of the 13 universities, the chancellor of Extension and UW Colleges, and the deans of the 13 colleges. The current system president is Ray Cross.

UW OSHKOSH POINTS OF PRIDE

At the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh, faculty, staff and students come together to form a distinctive institution that prides itself on engaging people and ideas for common good.

The following Points of Pride are some of the many achievements that set us apart:

Student Points of Pride

- UW Oshkosh has had the most successful Model United Nations Program in the world, receiving Outstanding Delegation awards at international competitions for the last 30 years.
- The College of Nursing passing rate for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) for undergraduate students continues to be one of the highest in Wisconsin.
- The *Advance-Titan* has won the top national award for student newspapers five times.
- More than 200 UW Oshkosh graduates have gone on to receive the Herb Kohl Teacher Fellowship of the Year award for excellence and innovation in teaching.
- The College of Business has the only university Student-Managed Endowment Fund, which began with a \$25,000 donation, and is now worth more than \$650,000.
- UW Oshkosh students who took the CPA exam placed the University in the top 10 of schools nationally.
- College of Letters and Science graduates are coveted by the best graduate programs in the nation.
- UW Oshkosh has won 46 national championships, including 31 NCAA Division III and three NCAA Division II competitions.

Campus Points of Pride

- Six individual faculty members and three departments have received the Regents Teaching Excellence Awards.
- At more than 13,900 students, the University's enrollment is holding strong at record levels over its more than 140-year history.
- College of Letters and Science faculty, staff and students serve as a cultural anchor to the region by contributing to the quality of life through theater productions, musical performances and art exhibits.
- UW Oshkosh is recognized as a national model for developing and highlighting exemplary campuswide liberal education programs.
- UW Oshkosh ranked 21st nationally — and first in Wisconsin — on the Sierra Club's Coolest Schools list for its sustainable practices.
- The UW Oshkosh Foundation partnered with the University to build the first dry fermentation anaerobic biodigester plant in Wisconsin, serving as a model community program for food and yard waste and assisting UW Oshkosh in meeting a state off-the-grid energy goal for campus.
- UW Oshkosh became the nation's first Fair Trade University in 2008. The University also was one of the first to analyze its carbon footprint.
- The total UW Oshkosh economic contribution to the state is more than \$500 million. The campus is responsible for directly and indirectly creating more than 9,000 jobs, generating more than \$37.5 million in tax revenue and giving more than \$4 million in time and money to local charities.
- UW Oshkosh has achieved more than 50 years of offering graduate studies, can boast of more than 13,000 graduate school alumni, and continues to be a leader in graduate education by offering more than 30 master's, post-master's and certificate programs as well as one doctoral program.

- **Kristofor Brown** (BS, radio-TV-film '88), former voice director and staff writer for the MTV cartoon series *Beavis and Butt-Head*, is the executive producer of Disney XD's *Kirby Buckets*.
- **Cliff Christl** (BS, political science '70), the official team historian for the Green Bay Packers, is quarterbacking the team's 100th anniversary in 2019.
- **Craig Culver** (BS, biology '73) is co-founder and president of Culver Franchising System Inc.
- **Anne (Angoli) Enright** (BS, journalism '97) is the director of media and measurement for Starbucks, headquartered in Seattle, Wash.
- **Norbert Hill** (BS, sociology '69, MSE '71) is the area manager for education and training for the Oneida Tribe.
- **Anton "Tony" Hopfinger** (BS, mathematics and physics '66), professor emeritus of medicinal chemistry and pharmacognosy at the University of Illinois, is known as the founding father of computational chemistry and chemistry informatics.
- **Christian Jensen** (BS, history and physical education '07), a personal trainer/group fitness instructor with Bellin Health in Green Bay, founded the Wisconsin chapter of myTEAM TRIUMPH, a nonprofit athletic mentoring program for challenged athletes.
- **Robert Keller** (BS, economics '69) is chairman of the board of J. J. Keller and Associates Inc., Neenah.
- **William Lecher** (BSN, nursing '87) works as the senior clinical director of Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center, while pursuing a doctorate in nursing practice at the College of Mount Saint Joseph.
- **Wendy Lewis** (BS, psychology '79), senior vice president for strategic alliances and diversity with the Chicago Cubs, has been recognized for her efforts to diversify Major League Baseball.
- **Christopher Mohr** (BA, religious studies '04) is the first Buddhist chaplain in the Wisconsin National Guard.
- **Thomas Puls** (BS, psychology '74), former cofounder of Donna Ricco, launched a new high-fashion menswear line called Crow Philosophy in New York, N.Y.
- **Shannon Stone** (BSE, special education '99) serves as the assistant director for East Asia with the U.S. Agency for International Development, Washington, D.C.
- **Luke Strand** (BBA, marketing and human resources '03), ordained a priest in May 2009, serves as vocational director for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.
- **Todd Teske** (BBA, accounting '87) powers Briggs & Stratton, the world's largest producer of gasoline engines and leader in outdoor power products with revenues exceeding \$2 billion annually, serving as the chairman, president and chief executive officer.
- **Thomas Zoch** (BS, biology and chemistry '79), of Neenah, is an executive leader of Ministry Health Care, associate medical director of Network Health and the medical director of Network HouseCalls.

UW Oshkosh Highlights

The scope of accomplishments at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh — given the budget cuts and tuition increases since 2000 — is astonishing, and it is a tribute to the oneness, vigor and dedication of our students, faculty and academic and University staff members. These highlights present a few examples of the University's success.

We have larger enrollments, and we have increased the number of students of color and adult students, degrees conferred and retention rates:

- Headcount enrollment increased by 2,218 to 13,902 students, up 19 percent.
- Full time enrollment increased by 1,544, up 16.6 percent.
- Enrollment of students of color more than tripled from 438 to 1,476.
- Enrollment of undergraduate adult students age 25-plus increased by 500, up 36.1 percent.
- Degrees conferred increased from 1,712 to 2,274, up 32.8 percent.
- The retention rate for first-year students increased from 72.2 to 75.1 percent.

We secured more grants and more private dollars than ever before:

- Grants increased from \$8.8 to \$11.2 million, up 27.3 percent.
- Foundation endowments increased from \$6 to \$14.9 million.
- Foundation total assets increased from \$7.4 to more than \$48 million. Our institution acquired funding for 12 National Merit Scholarships and 93 Academic Excellence Scholarships, a more than three-fold increase. We also secured our first-ever, fully endowed academic program chair — the Viessmann Endowed Chair in Sustainable Technology — supported through a major gift from CEO Martin Viessmann and his wife Annette, sustainable energy and efficiency pioneers of the Viessmann Group.

We raised the level of academic preparedness of our first-year students:

- ACT scores increased from 22.1 to 22.5.
- Academic Excellence and National Merit scholars increased from 44 to 105, up 139 percent.

We added tenure-track faculty positions and expanded support programs:

- UW Oshkosh received \$3.8 million in Growth Agenda funding for 27 new faculty positions.
- The new Student Compact provides \$1 million annually through differential tuition to enhance and integrate student academic support services.

We added new academic majors, graduate certificate programs and baccalaureate degree completion programs, including:

- Three New North-based, collaborative and workforce-responsive baccalaureate engineering technology majors in Mechanical Engineering Technology, Electrical Engineering Technology and Environmental Engineering Technology.
- Undergraduate majors in theatre arts, environmental studies and environmental health.
- Accelerated Math and Science Teacher Education Program in collaboration with five UW colleges.
- 13 new graduate certificate programs.
- Collaborative master's degree in social work with UW–Green Bay.
- Accelerated bachelor's degree for non-nursing graduates.

- Wisconsin’s first Bachelor of Applied Studies and Fire and Emergency Response Management degrees.
- The University’s first doctoral degree, the Doctor of Nursing Practice.

We enhanced our facilities by completing and launching approximately \$320 million in construction projects from 2000 through 2015, blending \$160 million in state investment with \$111 million in program revenue (from residence hall fee to business service fee revenues) and more than \$45 million in donor-University-private sector partnership investment. The campus and community transformation is characterized by:

- Halsey Science Center’s renovation to opening of the new academic center Sage Hall to construction and start-up of the Western Hemisphere’s first commercial-scale dry fermentation anaerobic biodigester, which generates energy and revenue from the controlled decomposition of crop, yard and food waste.
- Student affairs and residence life projects, including: the renovations of Taylor and Fletcher Halls, construction of the new Horizon Village residence hall, planned renovation of Reeve Memorial Union, the purchase and renovation of the 30,000-square-foot Newman Center for the Division of Academic Support of Inclusive Excellence and Women’s Center and construction of the nationally acclaimed Student Recreation and Wellness Center.
- A two-level parking ramp.
- The multi-phased renovation of Kolf Sports Center, the transformation of the Oshkosh Sports Complex and the planned, student-fee-funded and “bubbled” Recreational Complex.

- The construction of the 40,000-square foot UW Oshkosh Alumni Welcome and Conference Center.
- The renovation and modernization of Clow Social Science Center.
- Catalytic community projects with private partners, including the \$15 million renovation and revitalization of downtown Oshkosh’s waterfront hotel and convention center and the development of second and third biodigesters at Wisconsin’s largest dairy farm and one of its thousands of smaller, family dairy farms.
- The transformation of the former Oshkosh Area School District Lincoln Elementary School into Lincoln Hall, a new home for the Division of Lifelong Learning and Community Engagement and the Children’s Learning and Care Center.

We earned national recognition for our commitment to “green” principles and EPA LEED building design standards while improving water and energy conservation, reducing pollution and recycling:

- Received the 2003 EPA Leadership Award — one of the first ever presented to a university.
- Reduced emissions of coal/natural gas boilers by constructing a \$2.8-million heat plant stack.
- In 2012, we became the 25th institution in North America and the first in Wisconsin to earn the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education’s (AASHE’s) Sustainability Tracking, Assessment and Rating System (STARS) “Gold” rating.
- Received the Solid Waste Association of North America’s 2011 Silver Waste-to-Energy Excellence Award for our dry fermentation anaerobic biodigester facility.

Sue Panek

For more than 21 years, **Sue Panek** has served as the executive director of the Oshkosh Area United Way. Her record of leadership is strong and service driven. Panek recently completed her second term as president of the United Way of Wisconsin.

Panek's commitment to education is clear through her participation at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh. She serves as a member of the UW Oshkosh Human Services Advisory Committee and on the UW Oshkosh Chancellor's Advisory Committee. She also is an advocate for UW Oshkosh's new University Studies Program, especially Quest III.

Under Panek's leadership, the United Way has been an active partner with the College of Business to administer an IRS-supported Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program for elderly and low-income community members. This program provides a high-impact learning experience for students and works to find tax credits for those eligible, which has brought \$1 million in tax returns back into the Oshkosh area. She is an advocate for early education and literacy. The United Way has partnered with the Dolly Parton Imagination Library since 2008 to provide children up to the age of five with one book each month; Panek worked with the College of Education and Human Services to create a local study on the impact of the program. The United Way also partnered with the College of Nursing to provide confidential, cost-effective medical care to uninsured individuals.

Panek credits her career success in the Oshkosh community to the volunteers, staff and colleagues. Her commitment to her profession, church and community has provided many opportunities such as: supporting the volunteers who ran the first million dollar United Way campaign, establishing the Refugee Resettlement Task Force and the Hunger Task Force, and collaborating on the formation of the Oshkosh Area Community Pantry.

Panek provides exceptional leadership to the community and serves as a voice for quality of life and educationally-focused causes in the greater Oshkosh area.

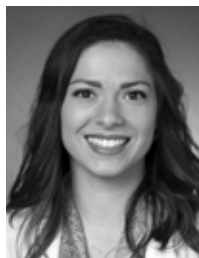
CHANCELLOR'S AWARDS FOR EXCELLENCE

CEREMONIAL TRADITIONS

Academic Procession

This commencement ceremony marks a special occasion for students completing degree programs offered by UW Oshkosh. The Chancellor grants diplomas by virtue of the powers vested in the office by the UW System's Board of Regents. In addition, academic degrees may only be granted upon the recommendation of the University's faculty.

The academic procession is a featured part of the commencement program — a symbolic declaration that all members of the academic community are bound by a common purpose and shared commitment to the ideals of higher education, including the search for meaning, truth and understanding.

Academic Attire

The colors and apparel worn in the processional are symbolic of the Middle Ages. Because universities developed from church schools, both faculty and students were regarded as part of the clergy and wore clerical clothing based on monastic dress.

The traditional hat developed from the skull cap worn in cold weather. In Europe, a bonnet with tassel is still worn, but in America it has been replaced by the mortarboard cap or tam with tassel.

The bachelor's gown, with its long, pointed sleeves, is worn closed. The master's gown has an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; the rear section is square cut. The doctor's gown often was furred, a decoration that survives today as the velvet on the front and sleeves. Graduate degree gowns may be worn open or closed.

The tassel colors seen in the processional correspond to the field of study: crimson, Bachelor of Liberal Studies and Bachelor of Applied Studies; drab (tan), Bachelor of Business Administration; light blue, Bachelor of Music Education, Bachelor of Science in Education and Bachelor of Science–Human Services; gold, Bachelor of Science; white, Bachelor of Arts; brown, Bachelor of Fine Arts; pink, Bachelor of Music; citron, Bachelor of Social Work; and apricot, Bachelor of Science in Nursing. Master's and Associate of Arts and Science degree candidates wear black tassels.

The Hoods

The academic hood originally was worn over the head in bad weather. Now, it is added to the apparel of those with master's and doctoral degrees.

The master's and doctor's hoods displays a gold and white chevron, denoting the University colors. The color of the velvet border represents the field of study in which the degree is awarded:

CEREMONIAL TRADITIONS

Honor Cords

Students wearing gold colored cords have earned the latin honors of cum laude, magna cum laude or summa cum laude.

Students wearing white colored cords have earned academic distinction within their college or unit.

Students wearing other cords, stoles or insignia wear them in recognition of scholarly achievement in a department or honor society or study abroad program or in the tradition of an international students' native country.

University Seal/ Chancellor's Medallion

The University Seal/Chancellor's Medallion symbolizes UW Oshkosh's history and aspirations. At the center of the medal is a fountain of knowledge, divided in three to reflect the school's commitment to realizing the creative power of individuals, the value of learning as a



humanizing force and our aspiration to excellence. The word “learning” is centered at the bottom, serving as the foundation of the University’s mission. The stylized figure at the center forms the school’s initials. The outward sweeping W reflects the Wisconsin Idea — education reaching to the state’s boundaries. The date of the University’s founding appears at the bottom, representing the importance of those who came before us.

Linked to the seal/medallion are nine more silver pieces inscribed with the names of previous UW Oshkosh presidents and chancellors:

George Sumner Albee, 1871–1898; Rufus Henry Halsey, 1899–1907; John H. Keith, 1907–1917; Harry Alvin Brown, 1917–1930; Forrest R. Polk, 1931–1959; Roger Earl Guiles, 1959–1973; Robert Birnbaum, 1974–1978; Edward M. Penson, 1978–1989; John E. Kerrigan, 1990–2000; and Richard H. Wells, 2000–2014.
