## Job Duties, split between all interns:

- 1. Event Planning
  - a. Assist with planning events held by the Center
  - b. Staff events, creating a positive experience for attendees
- 2. Event Marketing
  - a. Assist with marketing needs, including but not limited to: marketing design, poster distribution, side walk chalking, promoting messages around campus, social media management
  - b. Create and implement a social media presence for civic and community engagement activities
- 3. Student Engagement
  - a. Encourage students to participate in events sponsored by the Center related to the areas of volunteering, voting, interning and learning
- 4. Non-profit Engagement
  - a. Work with the Oshkosh Area United Way and the Volunteer Oshkosh website, recruiting new agencies to create agency profiles and volunteer events.
  - b. Meet with agency staff to train them in how to create posts on the website.
  - c. Promote agencies needs and assist agencies to share their message and recruit volunteers
- 5. Work on special projects as assigned by the Director of the Center for Civic and Community Engagement (i.e. web design, sponsorships and grant writing, database management, community engagement recognition, on-line initiatives.)
- 6. Maintain office hours.
- 7. Attend weekly meetings with the Center staff and other meetings as necessary.
