Students who took second languages courses in high school may receive retroactive credits accelerating the path towards degree completion. Adding a global language certificate allows students to:

- · take your speaking and writing skills in Japanese to the next level
- increase your knowledge of Japan and its culture using Japanese
- earn a credential in Japanese that appears on your transcript
- · stand apart on the job market by demonstrating achievement in Japanese
