Study in Germany!! We Offer a Variety of Programs to Meet Your Needs

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Studying in Germany is a smart investment in learning German and becoming familiar with its culture, especially if you are a GERMAN major/minor or even if you are studying for the new certificate. BUSINESS, COMP SCI/IT and ENGINEERING students, you have extraordinary internship opportunities even with basic German language skills. If you are a **GERMAN EDUCATION** major or minor, you need to earn credit abroad to fulfill the DPI residency requirement. No matter your major or what kind of program you choose, you will find many opportunities to experience German culture firsthand and to use the language to which some of you have already committed so many hours of study and practice.

There are many programs from which to choose—year-long and semester-long programs as well as short-term programs in January and in the summer.

For students in a professional program or those who would like to combine study abroad in Germany with career-related experience, there are organizations that arrange in-

ternships for students who meet certain qualifications. Students studying engineering, computer science, or business combined ideally with the study of German may apply for paid fall internships are available through the **Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (THM)**.

German Education students may consider teaching abroad through the **College of Education's** affiliation with **EAST**, which allows them "to complete part of their student teaching requirement abroad while meeting licensure requirements in Wisconsin."

There are several things to consider as you plan to study abroad in Germany. One is how studying abroad would affect your course of study at UW Oshkosh. Another consideration is that the German academic year (**Hessen Program**) is structured differently than ours. Its first term runs from October-November to February and its second term runs from April to the end of July. Many UW Oshkosh students who study abroad in Germany for one semester prefer going in the spring so as to avoid missing out on a portion of the UW Oshkosh academic

year. Lastly, advanced German students should study abroad for a semester or year once they have completed at least two courses on the 300-level.

For students on the beginning and intermediate levels, the semester-long **International Undergraduate Study Program (IUSP)** in Marburg and shorter summer programs such as the International Summer Universities (**ISU**) offered by Fulda, Gießen, Darmstadt, Frankfurt, Kassel, and Marburg and the International Winter University (**IWU**) in Fulda, Kassel, and Darmstadt are available. Each of these programs offers coursework in German language and a variety of content courses in English.

The Wisconsin-Hessen Exchange Program

The Wisconsin-Hessen Exchange Program offers year-long, semester-long, and short-term winter and summer study abroad programs at universities in Darmstadt, Frankfurt, Fulda, Giessen, Kassel, Marburg, and several other cities!

Semester- or year-long study is recommended for students who have had German on the 300-level at UW-Oshkosh; however, several universities do offer regular coursework and even entire programs in English, making it possible for students majoring in almost any subject to study abroad with far less than advanced proficiency in German. All programs require students to take intensive German—it's a great way to power up your proficiency and make real progress toward a UW Oshkosh German certificate (15 cr.), minor (21 cr.), or major (33 cr.)! Programs offered completely in German through the Hessen Exchange are ideal for German Education stu-

dents—they provide the greatest degree of immersion and opportunities for independence and meet the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction's (DPI) residency requirement.

Studying in Germany will require you to be responsible and persistent in pursuing your educational goals. While abroad, you will continue to have the support of the UW Oshkosh German Program and the Office of International Education.

International Summer (and Winter!) University Programs in Hessen

The **International Summer Universities (ISUs) and Winter Universities (IWUs) in Hessen** offer a program of courses, including (required) intensive German language courses at all levels, focused on specific topics of interest during fall interim (January) and summer (4-5 weeks). Often, most of the topic coursework offered is in English, so such courses could not be counted for German course credit at UW Oshkosh.

ISUs in the past have focused on teacher training, Germany's place in modern Europe and German fairy tales, among other topics; there are new, exciting offerings in International Business, Environmental, Electrical Engineering and even Earthquake Engineering!

The Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange Program for Young Professionals

The **Congress-Bundestag Youth Exchange Program for Young Professionals** is a competitive fellowship funded by the U.S. and German governments for students between the ages of 18 and 24 with career preparation in a professional area such as business or journalism.

"This scholarship program consists of two (2) months of language school; four (4) months of classes in your career field at a technical or professional school or

university; and a five (5) month internship in your career field. The CBYX is designed primarily for business, technical, vocational, and agricultural fields, though applicants from all fields may apply." Applications are due **December 1**. Learn German and Take Courses in English on the IUSP Program in Marburg!

Have you just started learning German—but absolutely cannot wait to study abroad, yet also do not want to "lose" a semester by going abroad in fall?

The **International Undergraduate Study Program (IUSP)** offered at the **Philipps-Universität Marburg** gives you the opportunity to take German language courses at the beginning or intermediate level along with a variety of content courses in English

and/or German. Courses are offered in subjects such as American & British Literature, Business, History, Political Science, and Geography.

Unlike other universities in Hessen offering coursework in English, the IUSP Program in Marburg runs from September to December and from February to June, allowing students to stay on track for timely graduation from UW Oshkosh.

"Educators Abroad Student Teaching (EAST) is a placement agency offering prospective teachers the opportunity to develop their teaching abilities and expand their cultural awareness by completing student teaching requirements in countries around the world (including Austria, Germany, Switzerland). **UW Oshkosh's affiliation with EAST, allows UW Oshkosh students to complete part of their student teaching requirement abroad while meeting licensure requirements in Wisconsin.**

Teaching opportunities are currently open to students in each student's proposed teaching area/s—liberal arts disciplines, in technical and vocational education, and in several fields of special education.

Students who would like to teach in other subject areas should contact the OIE for up-to-date placement options before beginning the application process. The **Hessen Exchange** is accepting applicants to the paid study & internship program offered by the **Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (THM)** for placements in **Fall 2020**. Most of these internships are in engineering and computer science, with some available in business. Students may earn up to 12 credits on this
