# Jamie Stark: 'If you're not nervous, you don't care.'

Preble High School alumnus Jamie Stark described the borders he's had to cross in his life as international, professional and social at the 2019 NEWSPA keynote "Journalists Without Borders: Promoting Social Change."

"All borders are invisible; every border is human-made. God never came down and said, 'This is the border, it's going to be this way forever,'" Stark said. "But you know when you're on one side or the other of a border. These three borders are very important to me and to the way that traditionally we do journalism."

Stark said he kind of fell into journalism because his high school girlfriend was the editor of the school paper, and he became the co-editor before studying journalism in college.

"If you're worrying about what your life calling is and you're trying to figure out what you're supposed to do in life, there isn't some passion hiding for you, you can pick it and work at it," Stark said. "I think it's bad advice when people tell you to go find your passion; you have to make it."

Stark crossed international borders when he moved to El Salvador after college in 2013, he said, where he worked for a food pantry and as a freelance reporter.

"The project I was volunteering with is the project I now run in San Francisco," he said. "It was a soup kitchen that also had a farm that employed homeless folks to grow food and cook food. The freelancing I did to pay my bills; I had this journalism degree and wanted to cover the stories where I was living."

Stark said the most important story he worked on in El Salvador was a story about a mining ban that was much more than that.

"The truth is not necessarily black and white, there's always details that make a story more human, more



complicated than a headline," Stark said. "This wasn't just about banning mining; it was about the government looking the other way while people suffered."

When the country banned mining, it hurt some of the locals who needed that income to survive. It also sparked a lawsuit in the World Bank Court.

"I was able to uncover this story of human complexity...," Stark said. "There's always details that make a story more complicated, more human than a headline."

While Stark watched protesters gather to promote the ban on mining while in El Salvador, it helped him in his next job running a non-profit to organize people and inspire change.

"With that many unified protesters, they were able to create a social movement despite their differences," Stark said. "In crossing my first border, I realized how much power there is in simplicity to promote social change or share a story."

In 2016, Stark crossed the border from reporter to practitioner when he started his non-profit Farming Hope, which provides transitional employment and training to homeless people in San Francisco. He said that he wanted to take what he learned volunteering in El Salvador and apply it to the U.S.

"I knew that someday I wanted to become an expert reporter on social enterprise...," Stark said. "I thought I could do that better if I worked for one."

The border between opinion and news writing is one that Stark has been straddling since 2008. He said he was the youngest elected delegate for the Democratic National Convention, which prevented him from covering politics for the Green Bay Press Gazette.

"Journalists, we are expected to hide our biases and write stories in a way that you can't tell," Stark said. "But I do sense in the way that you see news consumers gravitating to certain outlets that people do want to know what writers and producers of their news content think."

Stark said his biggest advice to anyone trying to enter journalism is to just show up because if you don't show up you won't have anywhere to start.

"If you're not nervous, you don't care," he said.

# NEWSPA executive secretary awarded 'Friend of Scholastic Journalism'

NEWSPA Executive Secretary and UW Oshkosh adjunct professor Barbara Benish was awarded the 2019 Skip Zacher Friend of Scholastic Journalism Award at the annual Northeastern Wisconsin Scholastic Press Association Conference on April 10.

Benish has been involved in NEWS-PA for decades, first as a student from Plymouth High School who attended the conference in the late 1970s, to serving as a judge and speaker, and for the last 11 years as executive secretary in charge of organizing the high school journalism conference and contests.

Benish said the award came as no surprise to her, but not because she was expecting it. "The award is supposed to be a surprise, and we try to keep it that way," she said. "But since I'm the one who signs the certificate, it was kind of difficult to keep it a secret from

#### myself."

As executive secretary, she has a multitude of duties and responsibilities to ensure the conference's success annually. She covers all of the many details that go into organizing such a large conference with 40 speakers and 400 students and advisers.

NEWSPA celebrated its 40th conference this year and in her acceptance speech, Benish thanked NEWSPA founder, Gary Coll, for his dedication and foresight to begin the organization. She explained that it was the conference and hearing UW Oshkosh journalism professors speak at the conference that made her decide to enroll here as a student.

"NEWSPA has had such a huge impact on my life. It is the reason I became a journalist," Benish said. "But the reason I have stayed with this organization so long is because of you, all of you..." she said to the high school advisers, speakers and others present during the luncheon and Board meeting.

2018 recipient Cindy Schultz, academic department associate for the Department of Journalism, presented the award to Benish.

"She is a proud alumna of the UW Oshkosh department of Journalism, who credits her decades-long career in journalism to both NEWSPA and the Department," said Schultz, who attributed Benish's contagious enthusiasm for growing the organization over the years. "Barb's energy and spirit have led to countless successes for NEWSPA, for the Department of Journalism and for UW Oshkosh."

The award is named after Skip Zacher, a former journalism professor and NEWSPA executive secretary. It has been awarded annually since 2000 to someone who has consistently made significant contributions to NEWSPA.

# Students compete for candy in NEWSPA journalism competition

Coffee enthusiasts spill the beans on their obsession

The substance that some PHS students refer to as "liquid gold" seems almost as essential to their day as oxygen.

The National Coffee Association surveyed 3,000 Americans over the age of 18 about their coffee obsession in 2018; 64 percent surveyed admitted to drinking a cup of coffee daily. Unsurprisingly, that ranks coffee as one of the most consumed substances across the nation.

Employee at the Exchange Bank cafe, senior Alex Turicik, one of the bigger coffee enthusiasts at PHS, said, "[My coffee obsession began in] May of 2018, and it's been a very steep incline of more and more coffee since then. [I began drinking a lot of coffee] in May [because] it's one of my busiest months of the year, and I resort to coffee to get me through the day and night," said Turicik.

Likewise, senior Lily Jirikowic is a coffee maniac. Compared to Turicik, who spends roughly \$12-\$20 on coffee per week, Jirikowic spends an average of \$50 per week on her liquid gold. "[I have to buy my coffee because] my parents were really addicted to it [a couple of years ago], so they quit drinking it and threw out our coffee maker," said Jirikowic.

Even though Jirikowic spends nearly quadruple the amount of money on her regular iced vanilla lattes, she normally drinks an average of two cups a day, whereas Turicik drinks nearly six cups of coffee a day, all while constantly switching up his order, or changing his flavored bean at home for his freshly brewed cup.

Both Jirikowic and Turicik agree that they drink coffee on the daily because it simply 'keeps them going' both physically and mentally.

When asked what side effects they experience, Turicik said, "All side effects are positive. Definitely gets me going in the energy aspect and makes me believe that I am ready to start the day."

Jirikowic and Turicik have made coffee an essential substance to their diet, so when they're without it, they experience a bit of a headache.

"When I don't have coffee, I'll try to look for substitutes like black tea; otherwise, I know I'll live, but I need some sort of caffeine, but not from a soda," said Turicik. "I'll also blame my grumpiness on [the absence] of coffee in my system," said Turicik.

Jirikowic and Turicik both seem to be extreme coffee enthusiasts. The two of them agreed to being addicted to the highly caffeinated drink, but between the two, Turicik seems to be a bigger coffee snob.

"Without a doubt, I am a coffee snob. I am very particular on the brewing process, what kind of beans are being used, the acidity of the beans, and [what type of] roast the coffee is. I judge people very harshly for using Keurigs," said Turicik.

Both seniors highly recommend making coffee an essential accessory, and proclaim, "Gotta drink the Java." However, by no means do newly coffee drinkers need to become coffee enthusiasts such as Jirikowic and Turicik.
