Fall 2014 University Studies Program Direct Assessment Results Executive Summary

Background

This report is part of our University Assessment plan, approved by the Faculty Senate. These data reflect responses to a survey administered to faculty members and will be part of the Oshkosh Student Achievement Report and the documentation for our Higher Learning Commission (HLC) visit. The following is a brief description of each table included in this report. It is followed by four tables which portray key items. The full survey results are available from University Studies Program (USP) or the Office of Institutional Research.

Table Descriptions

- Faculty members were asked to respond to questions in each University Studies Program (USP)
 they teach. <u>Table 1</u> indicates the departments these courses were from and the number of
 course sections covered by the survey.
- University Studies Program (USP) incorporates three broad Signature Questions that are woven throughout the Quest and Explore courses. Faculty members were asked to choose the question that corresponds to each Quest course they teach. <u>Table 2</u> shows how many faculty members chose each question.
- For each course the faculty members were asked to think about one assignment and indicate up to three Essential Learning Outcomes (ELO) that correspond to that assignment. <u>Table 3</u> reports the number of faculty members that chose to report on each of the Essential Learning Outcomes (ELO) aligned with the assignment of their choice for each of their courses.
- <u>Table 4</u> summarizes the students' performance levels by Essential Learning Outcome (ELO) as reported by each faculty member for the assignment of their choice. Table 4 is followed by charts detailing each ELO broken down individually to show proficiency levels.
