Dick Wueste – Assistant Vice Chancellor for Enrollment Management Search and Screen Committee

- a. Student Struggles – Speaker Dodge: Brought to my attention by an assembly rep that they are having trouble getting into their required classes. This doesn't really have to do with organizations, but your success at this university is the most important thing. I emailed Provost Koker immediately to set up a meeting so that we can talk about this problem. He is the head of the URAC and I have a meeting

set up with him on Wednesday. I need to know if people are having problems because it will back up my position when meeting with him.

Nursing and science majors are having problems because there are a lot of degrees that require both those classes. English Department requires classes from different focus areas that aren't offered. Some business classes are only offered once every four semesters. Education has the same problem especially in math. Courses aren't showing up on the website and the prereqs for courses aren't there either.

Noticed Oshkosh Students can see Fox Valley and Fond du Lac campus classes on Titan Web. Before the Restructuring people at the two small campuses were able to take classes on our campus and now we are fully integrated with the other two campuses and those classes still count toward your Oshkosh credit count.

Might there be a way to alleviate some of those scheduling problems since the credits are shared between the campuses? Trying to figure out some sort of transportation system between campuses to benefit all students.
