

Satellite Accumulation Areas

Waste generators at UW Oshkosh may store waste articles in designated satellite accumulation areas throughout campus. The campus central storage facility is located at 1155 Rockwell Avenue. Waste should only be delivered to the central facility by EHS staff.

The following locations throughout campus have been designated as satellite accumulation areas:

Department	Satellite Location
Art	A/C S13A
Biology	HS 135 (Biology Stockroom)
Chemistry	HS 450 (Chemistry Stockroom)

If your satellite accumulation area is full, contact us at 424-1488 or 424-7008 to request a pick up. Only 55 gallons of hazardous waste or 1 quart of acutely hazardous (EPA p-listed) waste may accumulate in the satellite area.

Persons generating waste must have access to the accumulation area as needed.

The relevant statute covering satellite accumulation of hazardous waste is quoted below:

- (3) SATELLITE ACCUMULATION. (a) A generator may accumulate as much as 55 gallons of hazardous waste or one quart of acutely hazardous waste listed in s. NR 661.33 (5) in containers at or near any point of generation where wastes initially accumulate, which is under the control of the operator of the process generating the waste, without an operating license or interim license and without complying with sub. (1) provided the generator does all of the following:
1. Complies with ss. NR 665.0171, 665.0172 and 665.0173 (1).
 2. Marks the containers either with the words "Hazardous Waste" or with other words that identify the contents of the containers.
- (b) A generator who accumulates either hazardous waste or acutely hazardous waste listed in s. NR 661.33 (5) in excess of the amounts listed in par. (a) at or near any point of generation shall, with respect to that amount of excess waste, comply within 3 days with sub. (1) or other applicable provisions of chs. NR 660 to 673. During the 3-day period the generator shall continue to comply with par. (a) 1. and 2. The generator shall mark the container holding the excess accumulation of hazardous waste with the date the excess amount began accumulating. Note: Special accumulation requirements for small quantity generators are in s. NR 662.192.

While the statute allows for either "Hazardous Waste" **or** other words that identify the contents of the containers, campus rules and our hazardous waste contractor require that the contents be labeled with chemical names or CAS numbers as well as hazard information.
