1. Call to Order – President Christopher called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.
2. Guest: Darryl Sims – Athletics Updates
Darryl thanked everyone for having him today as a guest, and also thanked Senator Marine for being one of the new Team Fellows to athletics this year. He then reported that after Spring 2020 Covid impacts that the NCAA canceled the sports for fall 2020 with student athletes not being charged for a year of eligibility and still being able to have 114 days of practice that could be used. As they transitioned into winter sports they navigated through testing student athletes, fund raising efforts as they determined how to pay for testing, testing measures, and weekly meetings with the Conference to continually work through efforts. Darryl noted the appreciation he has for all the staff that have been, and are still working hard to keep everything moving. He also noted the they are looking at what club sports could be in the fall at the access campuses. Senator Johnson was thanked for agreeing to serve as the chair to the Intercollegiate Athletics Committee this year and looks forward to working with their group. Darryl thanked Senate again for having him today and will be happy to share athletic updates in the future.
