**Instructions:** This worksheet is provided to students for the purpose of identifying courses needed to meet requirements for degree completion. Pages 2-3 of this handout lists USP requirements and the 100-200 level Pre-Social Work Gateway courses. These courses <u>must</u> be completed <u>before</u> formal admission to the major. Page 4 outlines the **Application for Admission** to the BSW Degree.

Pre- Social Work courses are normally completed within the **first 60 credits**. Students should have around 60 credits at the end of Spring semester they apply. It is the student's responsibility to periodically review and update this plan in order to determine progress (i.e., courses completed) toward degree completion. Students are strongly encouraged to meet with the BSW Program Coordinator to ensure all requirements have been met for the BSW degree and that the student is on track to graduate. In order to graduate with a BSW degree in 4 years, a student must complete 15 credits per semester.

# Application for Admission to the BSW Degree

Students who intend to apply to the Social Work major must complete the following requirements prior to application:

- USP requirements
- SW 167, Introduction to Social Work
- SW 220 or Human Development course
- SW 298 or Interpersonal Skills course

Applications to the BSW degree are only accepted in the Spring semester. **Students should have around 60 credits** completed by the end of the Spring semester they apply. Students admitted to the BSW degree program begin courses in the following Fall semester.

The BSW application will be posted to the Social Work website at the beginning of the Spring semester. The BSW application is due the Thursday before Spring Break at 3pm.

Additional requirements include 50 hours of volunteer service prior to application deadline. The form documenting these hours is located on the Department Web-page.

Application for Admission to Field Practicum (Applied Generalist Practice I (401) and II (451)) Students will submit a formal application for admission to the Field Practicum in the Spring semester. Only those who are formally admitted will be permitted to enroll in the 400-level courses. Students should have around 90 credits completed when applying to Field.

[1] If students enroll in PS 105 or PS 106 (H) (XS), Stats (XM), or History (XS) for their USP requirement then these courses will count in the 38 credits of USP, if not it will count as elective credits and a BSW degree requirement.
[2] If students enroll in Interpersonal Skills Substitute courses Comm 213Q1 (XC) or Comm 214 (XC), and Human Development Substitute courses Ed Found 235 (XS) or Nursing 200 (XS), for their USP requirement then these courses will count in the 38 credits of USP, if not it will count as elective credits and a BSW degree requirement.
[3] The number of electives may vary based on what courses count towards USP, and what courses count as electives and a BSW degree requirement.

[4] Mathematics (XM) of USP will be satisfied by taking one of the following: Math 114, Math109, Math 201, Math 301, Psych 203, Soc 281, CJ 281, Econ 210. If not taken as part of USP, then it will count as elective credits and a BSW degree requirement.

[5] A student may take a substitute Research and/or Policy course out of sequence from the course order listed above.
