UWO Goes Google!

Hopefully by now you have read the emails or been at a meeting where it has been discussed: we are moving from TitanMail (powered by Sun) to TitanApps (powered by Google)! By this point many have already transferred to the new system, including TitanApp Tutors and Early Adopters. Students will be moved starting July 1, and the rest of employees will transfer starting July 15 for the following three weeks.

You will receive an email with directions to activate your TitanApps account by signing in with a temporary password. When your time to transfer has arrived, you will receive an email "Mail now being delivered to your TitanApps account." At that point, all your current emails will be copied to TitanApps and all new mail will start to arrive there. Once the mail copy is completed, you will receive an email confirming this in TitanApps. You can still log-in to TitanMail until the end of the year. All of your email (except those in your trash) and contacts will be transferred. If you use a client, make sure all your emails are in Sun - emails on your computer will not transfer. Calendar and any filters will not transfer. If you already use your @uwosh.edu address with Google, you will need to change this (see website below for directions). TitanApps functions the same as any other gmail account – new options include conversation view, labels and archiving. There are lots of exciting options and flexibility with TitanApps!

Along with the email changing, we will be moving to a NetID for most of our log-ins. Your email log-in will no longer work for these. On June 28 and 29 many of those sites (Desire2Learn, Library database access, My Wisconsin portal [HRS], and WISDM) switched to log-in by NetID, which is your computer log-in. Other sites to change include Wireless, Plone, Titan Files (6/19), and MyUWOPortal/StarRez. PeopleSoft log-in remains the same. Representatives to be Added to CSAC

In February 2012, UW Oshkosh classified staff approved that the Classified Staff Advisory Council (CSAC) would serve as the official voice for classified staff on this campus. At that time, a survey was done asking if new members should be added, and if so, from what areas. Of the 95 responses received, 59% felt that additional members should be added. In regard to where additional representation should come from, 20% believed that the academic colleges should be more represented. The next areas where additional representation was requested included the trades (15%), facilities/custodians (10%) and blue collar (8%). In doing research of the numbers of staff that are within each of these areas, the CSAC has chosen to add two new seats to the Council. One person will be selected from classified staff within the College of Business, College of Education and Human Services, and College of Nursing while the other seat will come

from the Facilities Management area (Custodial Services, Facilities Administration, Grounds

Maintenance, Heating Plant Operations, HVAC, Structural and Lock Shop).

We know that some classified staff have limited or no work hours in the summer, but we are hopeful that all staff check email from time to time. The Council is urging anyone who is interested to self-nominate for one of the open seats. If you want to check us out, our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 8, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. in Sage Hall 2210. We will be accepting official nomination forms from August 13 through August 21—this can be done either via paper form or by sending an email to our elections committee (baina@uwosh.edu). Our goal is to hold the election August 27 through September 6. CSAC will officially welcome the two newly-elected members to the Council at the September 12, 2012 meeting.


The G.A.T.O.R. Award






